I can sweep the sidewalk with a child size broom, or rake leaves with a small rake.








# Teacher of the month Miss Tiffany Hall

### STEM Projects FOR June

WEEK 1 The sun is actually a star. The sun may be a star, but it is a powerful one. What would happen if we placed a dark paper outside with some objects placed on top and left it outside all day? Would the powerful sun do anything?

WEEK 2 The sun faded our paper and made it lighter last week. Could we protect the paper just like we protect ourselves from the sun? We will talk about the importance of wearing sunscreen and then put some sunscreen on paper. We will then place the paper in the sun to see if it will protect

our paper.

WEEK 3 Ice in our drinks melt faster when we are outside. Is there a difference between ice in something dark and ice in something light? We will experiment to see.

WEEK 4 Because we learned last week that ice melts faster on a dark surface. What about if we create shade for our ice? Shade keeps us cooler in the summer. Will our ice melt slower in shade or in the sun?
